Χρονικές εκφράσεις

this week/month/summer, tonight, this evening, tomorrow, tomorrow morning/afternoon/night, next week/month/year, at the weekend, in January, in a few minutes/hours/days, on Thursday, on Wednesday morning, etc

I / You / He / She / It / We / They will not (won't) have been learning.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • πράξεις ή γεγονότα που ξεκίνησαν στο παρελθόν και θα είναι ακόμα σε εξέλιξη σε συγκεκριμένη χρονική στιγμή στο μέλλον 	In two months' time, Jake <i>will have been living</i> in Paris for ten years.

Χρονικές εκφράσεις

by the end of this week/month/year, by this time tomorrow, by tomorrow morning/10 o'clock/2012

ALERT!

Δεν χρησιμοποιούμε stative verbs σε χρόνους διάρκειας.

FORM	USE	EXAMPLE
Present Simple I start. Does it start? We don't start.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • δρομολόγια και προγράμματα • με <i>no matter who/what/when/where/how/which</i> 	The plane <i>lands</i> at three o'clock. <i>No matter which</i> language class you choose, I'll be your teacher.
Present Continuous I am (I'm) meeting. Is she meeting? They are not (aren't) meeting.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • σχέδια που έχουν γίνει για το μέλλον (με χρονικές εκφράσεις) 	<i>I'm driving</i> to the countryside this weekend.
Other ways of expressing the future	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>be on the verge of + -ing</i> form • <i>be about to +</i> απαρέμφατο (infinitive) • <i>be on the point of + -ing</i> form • <i>be due to +</i> απαρέμφατο (infinitive) 	Doctors <i>are on the verge of finding</i> a cure. We <i>are due to board</i> the ship at noon tomorrow.
Temporals	Όταν χρησιμοποιούμε temporals όπως <i>when, before, after, until, once, by the time</i> , κλπ για να μιλήσουμε για το μέλλον, τα χρησιμοποιούμε με χρόνους present ή present perfect. Δεν τα χρησιμοποιούμε με χρόνο future. Χρησιμοποιούμε χρόνο present perfect για να τονίσουμε ότι η πρώτη πράξη ολοκληρώθηκε πριν ξεκινήσει η άλλη.	<i>By the time</i> the food arrives, it <i>will be</i> cold. <i>Once she has read</i> all the exam questions, she <i>will decide</i> which one to answer.
